

PolicyLab Compiles Resources on Proposed Public Charge Rule Change

Last month, the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) released proposed changes to the "public charge" rule. This proposal could block lawful permanent residence in the U.S. for immigrants who either use key safety net programs like Medicaid or are believed to be likely to use such benefits in the future.
