

Dr. Tiffani Johnson Interviewed on WHYY's RadioTimes about Implicit Bias Research

Numerous research studies have confirmed that minority children face severe disparities in their health and well-being compared to their white peers. These disparities stem from a number of significant factors such as physicians' implicit biases, a shortage of black and Latino doctors and poor access to high-quality health care.
