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ALL ABOUT THE COVID-19



COVID-19 started back in December 2019 in Wuhan, China, this is caused by a type of virus, more specifically a coronavirus called SARS-CoV-2.

What happens to the body

Once inside the body, it goes inside healthy cells and uses the machinery in those cells to make more virus particles. When the cell is full of viruses, it breaks open. This causes the cell to die and the virus particles can go on to infect more cells.

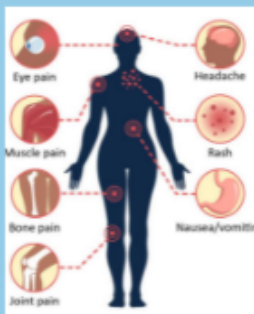


PORT OF ENTRY

Coronavirus enters the body through the nose, mouth, or eyes.

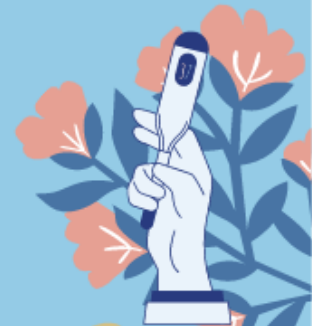
METHODS OF INFECTIONS

This virus can spread through contact with infected item, body fluids, and it is airborne.



SYMPTOMS

- Fever or chills
- Cough
- Shortness of breath
- Fatigue
- Muscle or body aches
- Headache
- Diarrhea
- New loss of taste or smell
- Sore throat
- Congestion or runny nose
- Nausea or vomiting



Treatment

Normally, without vaccines, our body will struggle a bit more to fight against the new infection and if the infection is too powerful, it can overwhelm the immune system. To lessen the infection, we can take vaccines that will help train our immune systems to create proteins to fight disease, these are called antibodies.



As of now, there are many clinics and places now open to give out vaccines

- In COVID-19, 'CO' stands for 'corona,' 'VI' for 'virus,' and 'D' for disease and this disease was discovered in 2019.
